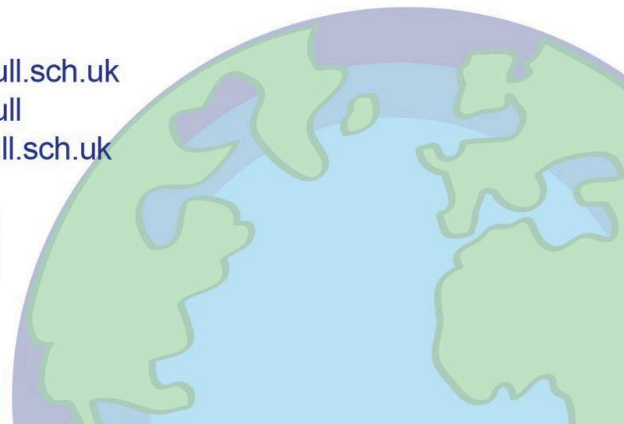

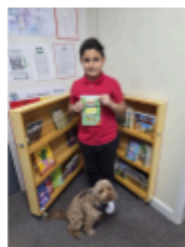

Guinness World Records turns 70!

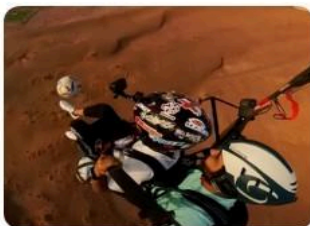
What is Guinness World Records (GWR)?

GWR is the best-known official organisation for recording and verifying records. A book is published each year, listing world records both of human achievements and the extremes of the natural world!

What's happening?

Guinness World Records, first published on 27th August 1955, is celebrating its 70th anniversary this year.

To mark the occasion, seventy unclaimed record titles, that anyone can attempt, have been announced!

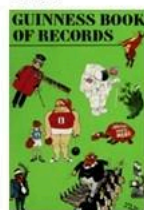

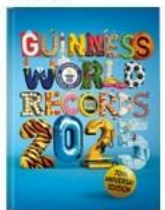
